Walk by faith, not by sight 11 Cor. 5-7, and faith comes by hearing the word of God. Romans 10:17. All that we do must be done in the NAME or by the authority of Christ Col: 3:17. What the Bible does not authorize cannot by done by faith. Many wants to walk by opinion in religion and do what they think ratherthan what the Bible teaches it is. An unsafe and unsoundly principle is to try to do a thing religiously just because the Bible does not expressly forbid it. We must find Bible authority for a belief or practice if it is to be by faith and we must have faith in God and His promises and obey and follow His Word. God does not always explain what he did or why he did it. Note in the Old Testament (because) and (therefore), these are key words and help to explain (God's) dealings with men. --When God wants a thing done for a certain reason or reasons it should be done for those reasons and no other. We are told that baptism is for remission of sin tobe saved we have to obey Mark 16:16. We need to get intothe name through Rom. 6,3,4, 1 Cor. 12:13 and Eph. 7, therefore men should not teach that baptism is not for an--· other purpose devised by man. Many take a passage of the Scripture and apply it to a subject that has no relationship whatsoever. If one wants to learn what the Bible says on baptism, he must go to a passage that teaches on baptism.

One cannot learn what God teaches on faith by turning to a passage where repentence is being discussed. Approach spiritual things from a spiritual viewpoint. Isa. 55: 8-9 "God's ways are not mans ways" for the natural man receiveth not the things of the Spirit of God for they are foolishness unto him neither can he know them because they are spiritually discerned. 1 Cor. 2:14.
