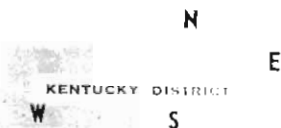

### Editorial:

Manuel J. Tharp, newly elected District Superintendent was born 1 August 1921 near Hohenwald, Tennessee of a poor family of seven brothers and one sister. He finished the eighth grade in a one room school and attended Lewis County High.

He entered military service in the Second World War and served in the U.S., Canada and England and was seriously wounded in France which brought 16 months of continuous hospitalization and discharged as a disabled veteran.

He and Sis. Tharp moved to Nashville, Tennessee where he enrolled in the University of Tennessee under the G.I. Bill.

In April 1949 they repented at the altar of the United Pentecostal Church in Goetsville, Tennessee. It wasn't very long until they had been baptized in Jesus Name and filled with the Holy Ghost.

It was in 1952 in Paducah, Kentucky that Brother K.V. Reeves knocked on their door and said God had sent him to Paducah to start a church. They readily agreed to help him establish a Home Mission work. It was during this time he was called into the ministry and found employment in Louisville with the Veterans Administration and attended the church pastored by Brother James S. Lucas.

From there they went to Murfreesboro, Tennessee and started a Home Mission work, and was Pastor for five and one half years, and held many revivals.

From there they went to Greenhill, Alabama and within two and one half years the attendance grew from seven members to over fifty baptized and filled with the Holy Ghost.

In 1966 they returned to Paducah to pastor the U.P.C. After that he was chosen as Presbyter in the Western District. He held this office until 1 January 1969 when he assumed the important position of District Superintendent. Bro. Tharp brings to this office a wealth of spiritual experience.
