OUR STORY

It was just a little white building that came along with the property that the Black Hills First United Pentecostal Church had purchased. No one at that time knew the awesome role this seemingly insignificant building would play in shaping hundreds of lives.

In the fall of 1970 Pastor J.H. Yohe's dream of reaching the young people of Rapid City began to unfold. The church decided they could best use the little building as a coffee house to draw young people. Bro. George O'Neal, who was an ex-drugger and had a burden for youth, became the first permanent resident of the home. The little white building was named the Lighthouse and because of its rapid growth, soon had to be remodeled.

At first the Lighthouse was only open to the public certain hours of the day for Bible studies. Soon the Lighthouse opened its 24 hour Youth Emergency Service (Y.E.S.). Rev. Ron Lovins became the first Lighthouse director. The Lighthouse was opened for evening Bible studies. Of course the discussion always turned itself to Bible salvation, and many young people found God through these meetings. Lighthouse cards were printed listing the various services offered by the Lighthouse ministry; spiritual help, friendship, someone to listen, a bed, a meal, and other services. In the first two years, five to ten thousand Lighthouse cards were distributed throughout the community and the world.

When Bro. Lovins left to pioneer a church in Huron, South Dakota, Rev. George Robbins assumed the directorship early in 1972. By then the Lighthouse was a local landmark. Hitch-hikers from all over the world found their way to the Lighthouse. Counciling services, police departments, bus depots, and even other churches would direct young men to the little white house on the corner of First and Kansas City.

The reputation of the Lighthouse in dealing successfully with young men began to spread across the nation. By 1972 many different Pentecostal churches around the nation were begging to send troubled girls to the Lighthouse, but there were no accomodations for them. A large two-story house adjacent to the church was bought and used to house the troubled girls. The house was named the Sheltering Arms and Sis. Linda Shahan

became the first house mother.

Soon the Lighthouse and Sheltering Arms were bulging. Many young men and women left, but more always came. It became apparent that larger quarters were needed to house the young residents. Within the next few years the Black Hills Youth Redemption Center shifted its occupants from building to building and house to house trying to make room for the young people who wanted to reside at the center. Conditions became cramped until

there was simply no place to house additional youth. The center struggled financially with the residents supporting nearly all of the costs.

Early in 1975 the church purchased 8 acres one mile north of their downtown location. The Sheltering arms was moved; and it was not until mid 1976 that it reopened its doors to troubled girls. During the period Sheltering Arms was closed, many of the girls were housed in church members homes.

In only seven years of operation the Black Hills Youth Redemption Center has shown the way to thousands of young people, of which many are working for God in the Rapid City Church. The center has been a refuge to young people from the ghettos of New York City to the prisons of California. Young men and women who had no place to go, no one to turn to, have found a new life in Christ Jesus through the efforts of the Lighthouse ministry. Many of the young people reached through this ministry are now ministers, ministers' wives, faithful saints, and soul winners. Why? Because someone cared!

With the continued prayers of hundreds of concerned supporters and the dynamic leadership of Pastor J.H. Yohe, Sr., the Black Hills Youth Redemption Center will continue to be a hand outstretched to thousands of souls before Jesus comes.

EDITOR'S NOTE:
We have recently heard Bro. Yohe personally deliver his burden. It is a comfort to know that there is a place like the Black Hills Youth Redemption Center where troubled young people can go. They are lovingly cared for while they find themselves and find God. No one is turned away regardless of their condition or situation.

The kids are in need of bunkbeds, chest of drawers, towels, sheets, bedding, and clothing. Some of the young people arrive with only the clothing on their back. The girls need dresses and the boys need everyday clothing plus clothing to wear to church. Their expenses run upward of \$1500.00 per month just to keep things running. Even buying groceries is quite an experience.
