Nearly everyone is asking--- "How does Sis. Lawrence like her new family of girls?"



**"TRINITY
MYTHS
EXPOSED"**

The Trinity doctrine is a myth. When the advocates of this theory are cornered, they state it is a mystery. It is supposed to be such a deep revelation that mere man cannot comprehend its truth, therefore, the "mystery" angle. The reason it has such a foothold in the minds of men stems from two main reasons. First, little children are taught the so-called trinity doctrine before they are able to reason for themselves. Secondly, most men are willing to let religious leaders think for them in the field of theology, instead of seeking individual truth. They simply don't care. The same pattern followed in politics or society causes men to embrace communism or socialism. Let the government think and act for us as long as we have shelter, food and some security. It demands some honest appraisal of theology and heartfelt conviction to pray and study for the truth that there is only One God, the Lord Jesus.

The fundamental doctrine of the trinity is that from the beginning there existed a God the Father, God the Son, and God the Holy Ghost,

all co-equal and all co-eternal. This theory teaches that all three have always been, and all have the same right, authority and power, therefore the "all-equal" portion of this man-made doctrine.

TAKE AN HONEST LOOK

The followers of trinity lay great stress upon such Scriptures as John 14:28..... "for my Father is greater than I." They assume that Jesus was speaking of another part of the trinity, (perhaps in heaven) which was greater than He. If this were true (and it is not) then the trinity advocates would destroy their own base of operation, because, this would make one God greater than the other, therefore unequal and not co-equal. Instead of strengthening their doctrine, it would destroy it.

The truth is this: Whenever you read Father, or Holy Ghost in the New Testament, it simply means the Spirit of God. Whenever you read of flesh or body (Heb. 10:5) it simply means Son. Luke 1:35 tells us that the Holy Ghost came upon the virgin Mary and the power of the highest overshadowed her and that Holy thing which was born of her was the Son of God. Mary gave Jesus his body or flesh, this was the Son. Jesus had no earthly father, therefore the only life He had was God or the Spirit within Him. God was in Christ reconciling the world unto himself. A one's spirit is greater than his body or flesh. It reaches out farther than the ability of a man's body. A simple example would be an electric light bulb, only one light but the glowing out is greater than just the glass bulb, --- nevertheless still only one light. The disciples got a little glimpse of this Spirit or Father that dwelt in Jesus Christ on the Mount of Transfiguration. Peter got so excited that he wanted to build three tabernacles. The Spirit that flowed out from the Son or body of Jesus Christ was greater than just his

physical being. But this had absolutely no thought or reference to more than one God.

LUKE 22:42

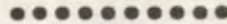
Congratulations are also in order for our many weddings this summer.
